Lesser Whistling-Duck

Dendrocygna javanica

Based on records from Jan to Jun 2023, ducks were seen at and around:

- Sungei Buloh, Lim Chu Kang Lane 3, Kranj Marshes, and Admiralty Park
- Sengkang Riverside Park, Lorong Halus Wetland, Hampstead Wetland Park, Coney Island and in the ponds at Pasir Ris Farmway 1 and 3,
- Pulau Ubin,
- Tanah Merah Country Club,
- Marina East Drive and Gardens-by-the-Bay,
- Singapore Botanic Gardens.

These sighting records are consistent with the previous years.

High counts were recorded from Marina East (twelve on 23 Jan 2023), Pasir Ris Farmway 3 (ten on 14 Jan 2023), Pasir Ris Farmway 1 (seven on 23 Jan 2023), Kranji Marsh (seven on 25 Mar 2023), Lorong Halus Wetland (six on 30 May 2023), Admiralty Park (five on 8 Apr 2023) and Sengkang Riverside Park (four on 5 Mar 2023 and 1 Jun 2023).

Over at Singapore Botanic Gardens, visitors noted mostly between one and two individuals within the garden's grounds during this period, with a maximum of three on 16 Jan 2023. This contrasted sharply with the initial count of eight when the ducks were being reintroduced at the Eco Lake between Jan and May 2022, as well as counts of seven birds between 16-17 Sep 2022 and six birds between Jul and Aug 2022.

There were 1,774 Red Junglefowl records as of end-Jun 2023. High counts were noted from Singapore Botanic Gardens (estimated fifty on 6 Jan 2023, 23 Jun 2023 and 30 Jun 2023), Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park (forty-six on 14 Jun 2023), Pasir Ris Park (forty on 14 Jun 2023), Coney Island East (twenty-five on 11 Jan 2023), Clementi Woods Park (twenty-two on 20 Apr 2023), West Coast Park (twenty-one on 9 Apr 2023), Duxton Plain Park (twenty on 27 Feb 2023) and Labrador Nature Reserve (twenty on 10 Apr 2023 and 17 Jun 2023). Do note that there would be records that are likely to be hybrids or domestic fowl counted as wild birds.

Blue-breasted Quail (King Quail)

Synoicus chinensis

Between 2 and 14 Jun 2023, single birds were spotted from around the grass fields at Pasir Ris Farmway 3, while a single bird was seen at Lorong Halus Wetland on 4 Jun 2023.

Japanese Quail

Coturnix japonica

A single individual was reported from Jurong Lake Gardens on 29 Apr 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Little Grebe Tachybaptus ruficollis

Between 5 Jan 2023 and 29 Jun 2023, between one and eleven Little Grebe were seen within the ponds of abandoned fish farms at Pasir Ris Farmway 1. High counts were observed on 21 Jun 2023 (eleven), 23 Jun 2023 (eight), and 29 Jun 2023 (five). There was one unconfirmed report of a single bird seen at River Safari on 10 May 2023.

Oriental Turtle Dove

Red Collared-Dove

There were twenty-eight records for the first half of 2023. The bulk of records (17) were from Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve and Neo Tiew (4). The rest were single records from Pasir Ris Farmway, Pasir Ris Park, Pasir Ris Town Park, Kranji Marshes, Singapore Botanic Gardens and Marina East. Five birds were seen at Lorong Halus Wetland on 30 May 2023.



Spotted Dove

A total of 2,542 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: a nest with two chicks in April 2023.

Asian Emerald Dove

Chalcophaps indica




Map showing sighting locations of the Asian Emerald Dove between Jan and Jun 2023.

A total of 190 sighting records were submitted for the first half of the year. One hundred and thirty-two of the records were within the Central Catchment and adjoining buffer Nature Parks such as Bukit Batok Nature Park, Bukit Timah Nature Reserve, Chestnut Nature Park, Dairy Farm Nature Park, Hindhede Nature Park, Jalan Ulu Sembawang, MacRitchie Reservoir Park, Rifle Range Link, Singapore Quarry, Springleaf Nature Park, Thomson Nature Park, Windsor Nature Park. Birds were also encountered at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, Admiralty Park, Bukit Brown Cemetery, the Kranji Marshes, Pulau Ubin and Pulau Tekong. Records outside these core and peripheral areas include single records from Gallop Road (11 Mar 2023), Admiralty Park (7 Mar 2023 & 8 Apr 2023), Ang Mo Kio Park near Luxus Hills (7 Jan 2023), Changi Business Park (22 Feb 2023), Clementi Woods (28 Apr 2023, 11 May 2023 and 27 Jun 2023), Holland Plain (26 Feb 2023), Jurong Lake Gardens (24 Feb 2023), and Singapore Botanic Gardens (17 Jan 2023 and 29 Mar 2023).

A total of 1,496 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Map showing sighting locations of the Pink-necked Green Pigeon between Jan and Jun 2023.


A total of 2,460 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. A high count of 200 was made at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 26 Feb 2023.

Other records: an adult male and its chick on a nest in April 2023, a male on a nest with two eggs in May 2023

Cinnamon-headed Green-Pigeon

Treron fulvicollis

An individual was observed near the Living Lab on Pulau Ubin on 22 Apr 2023.



Thick-billed Green-Pigeon


Map showing sighting locations of the Thick-billed Green Pigeon between Jan and Jun 2023.

The bulk of records were reported from Bukit Timah Nature Reserve, the Central Catchment forest, Dairy Farm Nature Park, Rifle Range Link, Thomson Nature Park and Windsor Nature Park during the first half of the year. High counts included eight birds from Bukit Timah Nature Reserve on the morning of 24 Jun 2023, and eight individuals from Jelutong Tower on 8 Jan 2023. Other localities where birds were seen included Jurong Lake Gardens on 23 Jan 2023 and 16 Apr 2023 (single birds on both occasions), Pearl's Hill City Park on 27 Feb 2023 where six were seen, and the Singapore Botanic Gardens on 25 Jan 2023 (four birds), 9 Mar 2023 (single bird), 10 Mar 2023 (two seen) and 13 Mar 2023 (single bird).

There were 21 sighting records for this report. A total of 15 records were from Central Catchment and the buffer parks, with eight sightings at Dairy Farm Nature Park between 7 May and 26 Jun 2023. Six sightings were outside the Central Catchment. A female was seen between 10am and 1.24pm on 26 Jan 2023 within the Fragrant Garden grounds at the Singapore Botanic Gardens, while a single female was seen on the garden grounds on 16 Feb 2023. Single birds were seen at Lorong Halus Wetland on 22 Mar 2023, Jurong Lake Gardens on 22 Apr 2023 and a single female was seen with parakeets in a tree at Changi Village on 23 May 2023.



Green Imperial-Pigeon

There were 28 sighting records for the first half of 2023. The bulk of sightings continue to be concentrated in the east at the canal at Changi Business Park and Pasir Ris Park, where a maximum of seven were seen on 1 Apr 2023. Up to five birds were reported from Pulau Tekong on 2 Feb 2023, while another two were seen on 27 Feb 2023. Birds were also seen at Pasir Ris Farmway, Punggol Park, Changi Bay Point and Pulau Ubin.


Sightings continue to be recorded outside their eastern enclave, with a report of a single bird from Katong on 14 Jan 2023, two records from Singapore Botanic Gardens on 11 May 2023 (single bird) and 24 Jun 2023 (six birds) and one record from Windsor Nature Park on 25 Mar 2023 (5 birds).



Pied Imperial-Pigeon

There were 400 records from Jan to Jun 2023. Majority of sightings were clustered around the western, north-western, central and southern parts of Singapore. Birds continue to be seen on Pulau Ubin (between 19 Mar 2023 and 23 Jun 2023 (usually between one and two birds, with a high of five on 23 Jun 2023)), Lorong Halus Wetland (22 Mar 2023 (single bird)), Pasir Ris (8 Jan 2023 and 16 Mar 2023; with five seen at Pasir Ris Farmway 1 on 23 Jan 2023). Other record: one dead at the foot of HDB block 204, Bukit Batok Street 21 on 22 Apr 2023.

There were 46 sighting records. Pairs were seen at Holland Plain (28 Feb 2023), Pulau Ubin (24 Apr 2023) and Gardens-by-the-Bay (20 May 2023). Besides the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks, these hardy birds were seen or heard at a variety of habitats such as the suburban Dempsey (3 Jan 2023), the mangroves along Berlayer Creek Boardwalk (18 Mar 2023), the Rail Corridor (28 Apr 2023 and 4 May 2023), Dover Forest (13 Mar 2023 and 30 May 2023), the forest patch at Goldhill Avenue/Malcolm Road (30–31 Mar 2023 and 30 Jun 2023), Singapore Botanic Gardens (26 Apr 2023) and Ulu Pandan Park Connector (12–13 Jan 2023 and 9 Mar 2023).




Map showing sighting locations of the Lesser Coucal between Jan and Jun 2023.

There were 164 sighting records from suitable habitat with grassy fields and lalang (*Imperata cylindrica*). Pairs were spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens between 9 Apr 2023 and 24 Jun 2023, Kranji Marsh (26 Feb 2023 to 18 Jun 2023), Lorong Halus Wetland (30 May 2023), Marina East Drive (4 Jan 2023 to 30 Apr 2023), Pasir Ris Farmway (17 & 24 Jun 2023), Seletar Aerospace Crescent (11 Jan 2023), Sungei Tengah (28 May 2023) Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve (27 Feb 2023), and Ulu Pandan (23 Apr 2023). Three birds were seen at Seletar West on 26 Mar 2023 and Sungei Buloh on 2 Apr 2023.

Chestnut-bellied Malkoha

Phaenicophaeus sumatranus



Map showing sighting locations of the Chestnut-bellied Malkoha between Jan and Jun 2023.


There were 51 sighting records. Birds were seen within the Central Catchment and adjacent buffer parks, such as Bukit Batok Nature Park, Dairy Farm Nature Park, Rifle Range Link, Thomson Nature Park, Upper Peirce Reservoir Park, Upper Seletar Reservoir Park and Windsor Nature Park. There is an unconfirmed record from Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve on 7 May 2023. There were no records of the Malkoha from Jurong Eco Garden or Singapore Botanic Gardens during the first half of 2023.

A high count of seven birds were recorded from the Central Catchment on 29 Jan 2023, with five seen passing by Dillenia Hut in a bird wave and two more in a mixed flock at the Ranger's Station. Four birds were seen at Bukit Timah Nature Reserve on 18 May 2023 and at the Central Catchment on 1 Jun 2023, while pairs were seen at Bukit Batok Nature Park on 7 May 2023, foraging near the park's toilet, at Hindhede Nature Park on 15 Jan 2023, Thomson Nature Park on 16 Jan 2023, and Upper Seletar Reservoir Park on 17 Jan 2023, besides sightings within the Central Catchment core on 15 and 29 Jan 2023, 12, 14, 18 & 26 Mar 2023, 13, 14 and 21 Apr 2023, 25 May 2023 and 10, 11 & 13 Jun 2023.

There were sixteen records. The last record for the season for this migratory cuckoo was on 28 Apr 2023 when an individual was heard along Ulu Pandan Linear Park. Another April sighting was recorded on 2 Apr 2023 when one bird was seen foraging along the canal at Changi Business Park. Other sighting locations included Dairy Farm Nature Park (5 & 10 Mar 2023), Gardens by the Bay (31 Mar 2023), Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 (20 Jan 2023), MacRitchie Reservoir Park (22 Jan 2023), Punggol Promenade Nature Walk (6 Feb 2023), Rifle Range Nature Park (21 Jan 2023 & 19 Feb 2023), Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve (21 Jan 2023 and 3-4 Feb 2023) and Thomson Nature Park (12 Feb 2023).



Based on the above chart, there appears to be a peak movement period between Jan and Feb 2023, with sightings petering out in Mar and Apr 2023.

Asian Koel

Eudynamys scolopaceus

A total of 1,479 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Violet Cuckoo

Chrysococcyx xanthorhynchus

A total of 25 records were reported. All were from the Central Catchment and buffer parks. Dairy Farm Nature Park (10 records) and the area between Rifle Range Link and Jelutong Tower (12 records) are the best locations to spot the cuckoo.

Little Bronze-Cuckoo

Chrysococcyx minutillus

A total of 114 records were reported. There were no reports of host and juvenile interactions during this period.

Banded Bay Cuckoo

Cacomantis sonneratii

There were 104 sighting records during this period. On 2 Jun 2023, a juvenile was seen being fed by a Common Iora *Aegithina tiphia* at Singapore Botanic Gardens.

Plaintive Cuckoo

Cacomantis merulinus

There were 185 sighting records. Birds were heard throughout all the months, with no distinct peak seasons. There were no reports of host and juvenile interactions during this period.

Rusty-breasted Cuckoo

Cacomantis sepulcralis

There were 85 records during this period. There were no reports of host and juvenile interactions during this period.

Square-tailed Drongo-Cuckoo

Surniculus lugubris

There were 126 records. There were 21 records outside the Central Catchment and buffer parks. All records, except for one, were between Jan and Apr 2023, which is the migration season, suggesting that the cuckoos seen outside the central core areas are migratory birds. These locations are – Changi Business Park, Coney Island, Gardens-by-the-Bay, Jurong Lake Gardens, NUS Central Library-Science Faculty, and Singapore Botanic Gardens. The single outlying area, viz. Telok Blangah Hill Park, had a record outside the migration season, and could be harbouring a population of resident cuckoos.



Large Hawk-Cuckoo

Hierococcyx sparverioides

Large Hawk Cuckoo at Jurong Lake Gardens on 14 Feb 2023 (Thomas Koh).

There were 24 records for the first half of 2023. The last record for the season came from a single bird at the Eco-Lake at Singapore Botanic Gardens on 29 Apr 2023. The bulk of sightings have been at Jurong Lake Gardens (75%), with sightings of single individuals at varied locations such as Admiralty Park (3 Feb 2023), Coney Island (2 Jan 2023), Hindhede Nature Park (1 Feb 2023), Kranji Marsh (21 Jan 2023), Singapore Quarry (14 Feb 2023) and the aforementioned sighting at Singapore Botanic Gardens.

Other records: a single bird was spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens on 14 Feb 2023.

Hodgson's Hawk-Cuckoo

Hierococcyx nisicolor

The last record for the season was an individual spotted within the Central Catchment on 12 Apr 2023. Of the eight records, six were from Jurong Lake Gardens, underscoring the value of this large public park as a holding area for migratory species. Apart from the previously mentioned sighting in the Central Catchment, the other record was from a private residency in Kovan.

Other records: a single bird was spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens on 14 Feb 2023.

Malaysian Hawk-Cuckoo

Hierococcyx fugax

The last record for the season came from two birds seen on 25 Mar 2023 at Jelutong Tower within the Central Catchment. All seven records for the first half of this year came from the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks (Dairy Farm and Windsor Nature Parks).

Indian Cuckoo

Cuculus micropterus

There were 17 records, with five each from Jurong Lake Gardens and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, four from the Central Catchment and buffer parks, and one each from Changi Business Park, Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 and Sentosa. The last record for the season came from a single bird on 18 May 2023 at Bukit Timah Nature Reserve.


Grey Nightjar


Map showing sighting locations of the Plume-toed Swiftlet between Jan and Jun 2023



Nesting was observed at Margaret Drive between 26 Mar 2023 and 16 Apr 2023. Social media reports indicated that the chick fledged on 17 Apr 2023, after three weeks of growth and development. A high count of between 11 and 19 birds were seen at Mount Sinai between 3 Jan 2023 and 6 Mar 2023, with 19 birds seen on 5 Feb 2023.

Other record: nesting (egg visible) occurred again at Margaret Drive on 22 Jun 2023

Birds were frequently seen at Jurong Lake Gardens throughout the first half of the year, with eight birds seen on 8 Apr 2023 and seven birds on 15 Apr 2023. They were also seen in other locations with suitable habitat, such as Berlayer Creek Boardwalk, Clementi Woods, Holland Linear Park, Kranji Marsh, Lim Chu Kang Lane 3, Lorong Halus Wetland, Marina East Drive, Neo Tiew Harvest Lane, Seletar/Piccadilly, Sungei Buloh, Tampines Eco Green, Tuas South Avenue 16, and Ulu Pandan Park Connector, etc. Breeding recorded. A single juvenile was seen foraging at Gardens by the Bay on 16 Jun 2023, while single juveniles were spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens on 2 Jan 2023, 10 Jan 2023 and 17 Jun 2023, and an adult with chicks were seen on 7 May 2023 at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve.

Eurasian Moorhen

Gallinula chloropus

Mostly single birds were seen at Lim Chu Kang (8 to 24 Jan 2023), Marina East Drive (1 Jan 2023 to 29 May 2023), and Singapore Botanic Gardens (4 Jan 2023 to 1 May 2023). Breeding recorded. Two adults and a chick were seen at Marina East Drive on 1 Jan 2023. Subsequently, up to three juveniles were seen on 2 and 23 Jan 2023; eventually, two were seen on 17 Feb 2023, while only one was observed on 10 Mar 2023.







Breeding recorded, with two records from the Botanic Gardens. Two adults and a chick were seen on 14 Jan 2023, while two adults and three juveniles were spotted on 10 Jun 2023.

There were 92 records. A large number of records (47; 51%) came from Jurong Lake Gardens. Birds have been spotted at urban/suburban locations such as a single individual at Holland Plain on 1 Mar 2023 and a pair at Clementi Linear Park on 22 Apr 2023. Breeding reported. Three chicks and two adults were seen on 15 Apr 2023, while between one and two juveniles were seen between 7 May 2023 and 11 Jun 2023 at Jurong Lake Gardens. Two adults and two chicks were seen at Tampines Eco Green on 27 Jan 2023.

Baillon's Crake

Sightings of a single bird were recorded from Marina East Drive between 13 Feb 2023 and 10 Mar 2023.

On 7 Feb 2023, a single bird was seen foraging in a pond, while an individual was seen circling over the ponds on 17 Jun 2023. On 24 Jun 2023, two birds were seen foraging in a pond as well.











Birds continue to be found mainly at Marina East Drive, Rower's Bay at Seletar, and NSRCC at Tanah Merah. High numbers of up to 15 have been reported at Marina East Drive. No breeding was reported.



Lesser Sand-Plover

The last sizeable count of 12 birds was seen off Chek Jawa on 6 May 2023. Single or two birds continue to be seen along the Marina Barrage between 6 and 28 May 2023, while nine birds were spotted off Chek Jawa on 23 Jun 2023; these are most likely stragglers and over-summering birds. High counts above 100 occurred from 9 to 23 Jan 2023, with an estimated peak of 500 on 20 Jan 2023.

Greater Sand-Plover

A single bird was reported from Chek Jawa among Lesser Sand-Plovers on 18 Feb 2023.

Malaysian Plover

Charadrius peronii

Observations for this period came from the Marina East breakwater. High counts of seven and above were observed from 23 Jan 2023 onwards, with a high of twelve birds on 25 Mar 2023.

Kentish Plover

Charadrius alexandrinus

Between five to eight birds were seen along the breakwater at Marina East Drive between 1 Jan 2023 and 19 Mar 2023, with a peak of eight individuals on 13 Feb 2023. The last record for the season came from an individual at the breakwater on 27 May 2023.



White-faced Plover

Charadrius dealbatus

White-faced Plover at Marina East Drive on 4 Mar 2023 (Tan Gim Cheong).

All records came from the breakwater at Marina East Drive. The last bird of the season was recorded on 7 May 2023. Between three to four birds were counted between 1 Jan 2023 and 1 Mar 2023. This was consistent with the highest count of four birds seen between Oct and Dec 2022.

Little Ringed Plover

The last record for the season came from an individual spotted at Marina East on 4 Feb 2023, as well as three birds at Pasir Ris Farmway 1 on the same day. High counts of between four and six birds were recorded from Pasir Ris Farmway between 6 and 22 Jan 2023. Other locations included Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 where a single bird was recorded on 17 Jan 2023, and Sungei Buloh, with one individual recorded on 3 Feb 2023.

Greater Painted-Snipe



The bulk of sightings were from the fields around Marina East Drive, where 71% of the 45 records were concentrated. Up to eleven birds were seen between 1 Jan 2023 and 27 Jun 2023. Fourteen of the 32 records from Marina East Drive occurred after 6.30pm. On 16 Jan 2023 at around 8.54pm, the eleven birds were spotted, five in one pool while others were in pools singly or in twos, while on 24 May 2023 when five individuals were recorded, birds started calling after sunset and were seen flying around or standing in puddles. Other locations included Lorong Halus Wetland (1) on 30 May 2023, Neo Tiew Harvest Lane-Turut Track with six on 7 Jan 2023 and five on 16 Jan 2023, and Seletar End, where five were seen on 8 Jan 2023 and 24 Apr 2023.

Whimbrel

The last record for the season would be a sighting of 50 birds at Sungei Buloh on 24 Apr 2023. Individuals and small numbers seen after that would be stragglers and over-summering birds, including five Whimbrels spotted at Chek Jawa on 27 May 2023. High counts included 148 on 8 Jan 2023, 140 on 5 Feb 2023, 130 on 26 Mar 2023, 128 on 25 Mar 2023, and 100 on 9 & 13 Jan 2023, and 24 Mar 2023. These counts were from Sungei Buloh.

Bar-tailed Godwit

Limosa lapponica

Not more than three of the godwits were reported from Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin from 19 Jan 2023 to 26 Mar 2023. Observers noted that birds began to acquire their reddish breeding plumage from 17 Feb 2023 onwards, and the last record for the season was from a single record on 26 Mar 2023.

Ruddy Turnstone

Arenaria interpres

The last record for the season came from a sighting of three individuals feeding on Loyang/Squance Rocks during low tide on 25 Apr 2023. Ten birds were seen on 9 Apr 2023, while on 10 Apr 2023, four were spotted from Changi Boardwalk by an observer with a scope. Birds have also been recorded from Pulau Seduku off Chek Jawa between 19 Jan 2023 and 26 Mar 2023. High counts were recorded on 26 Mar 2023 (9), 16 Mar 2023 (7), 17 Feb 2023 (9) and 21 Jan 2023 (8).

Broad-billed Sandpiper

Calidris falcinellus

Single birds, and occasionally pairs, were seen from Chek Jawa between 7 Jan 2023 and 4 Feb 2023, which was the last available record for this season. Five birds were counted on 20 Jan 2023, while four individuals were spotted on 21 Jan 2023.

Curlew Sandpiper

Calidris ferruginea

The last record for the season was on 21 Jan 2023, comprising two birds feeding on the sand bar off Chek Jawa's boardwalk during low tide. One bird was seen the day before at the same location with the Broad-billed Sandpipers.

Red-necked Stint

Calidris ruficollis

Eight birds seen off Chek Jawa on 18 Feb 2023 constituted this season's last record. Sizeable numbers were spotted at the same locality between 7 Jan 2023 and 4 Feb 2023, with highs on 7 Jan 2023 (15), 20 Jan 2023 (40), and 23 Jan 2023 (20).

Common Snipe

Gallinago gallinago

The last record for the season was of a single bird at Marina East Drive on 4 Apr 2023. Single birds, and occasionally pairs, were seen at Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 between 9 and 24 Jan 2023, while three were seen at another location at Lim Chu Kang. And individual was seen off Piccadilly/Seletar End on 18 Feb 2023 while two were spotted at Holland Plain on 28 Feb 2023.

Pin-tailed Snipe

Gallinago stenura

The last record for this season was an individual seen from Berlayer Creek Boardwalk on 8 Apr 2023. An individual was seen at Holland Plain on 2 Apr 2023, while another was spotted within the grounds of Kranji Marsh on 19 Mar 2023. Two birds were also seen from Berlayer on 18 Mar 2023.

Terek Sandpiper

Xenus cinereus

The last record came from Pulau Ubin of two birds spotted on 28 May 2023. Chek Jawa continued to host birds, with mostly records of single individuals and pairs between 19 Jan 2023 until the penultimate date of 28 May 2023. Three individuals were counted on 20 Jan 2023. A single individual was spotted at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve on 4 Jan 2023 and continued to be seen until 18 Mar 2023. One observer noted on 25 Feb 2023 that the bird seen that day was the famed B5 first tagged in 2013, spotted together with a group of Common Redshanks.

Common Sandpiper

The last record for the season was an individual seen at the vicinity of Marina East Drive on 3 May 2023.







As such, the more likely last record for the species this season would be one record on 19 Apr 2023 at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserves.; prior to this, there were two records of 50 birds from the same venue on the morning and noon of 15 Apr 2023. High counts were recorded on 18 Feb 2023 (220), 2 Jan 2023 (200), 8 Jan 2023 (150), 18 Mar 2023 (140), 7 Mar 2023 (125), 19 Jan 2023 (100) and 4 Jan 2023 (100).

Barred Buttonquail

Turnix suscitator

Two birds, a male and female, were spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens between 1 Jan 2023 and 24 Jun 2023. However, without marking or banding, it is difficult to tell if there are two or more individuals present. Single birds were also spotted at Chang Bay Point on 19 Apr 2023 and 10 May 2023, Coney Island on 16 Jun 2023 and Holland Plain on 1 Mar 2023. There were no breeding records on eBird.

Other records: Breeding recorded from Jurong Lake Gardens from a photograph of a male with two chicks taken on 30 Apr 2023 by Max Cheo.




Between two and three were seen on 6 May 2023 while two were spotted on 29 Apr 2023 by birders on pelagic trips within the Singapore Straits.

White-winged Tern

Twenty were seen off Marina East Drive on 25 Jan 2023, while individuals were seen off Chek Jawa on 7 May 2023. A high count of 120 was recorded on 6 May 2023 along the Singapore Straits. Another pelagic trip along the Straits yielded 40 individuals.

Whiskered Tern

Chlidonias hybrida

Up to two individuals were spotted off Singapore Straits on 29 Apr 2023.

Black-naped Tern

Sterna sumatrana

Birds were mainly seen at the Loyang Rocks and Changi between 9 Apr 2023 and 6 Jun 2023, with counts of between 6 (1 Apr 2023) and 20 birds (10 Apr 2023). A good number were also reported off Pulau Ubin between 5 Apr 2023 and 28 Jun 2023, with high counts on 18 Apr 2023 (13), 6 Apr 2023 (10), 22 Apr 2023 (9) and 1 May 2023 (9). Individuals and pairs were also seen off Gardens by the Bay (13 May 2023 & 9 Jun 2023), Lorong Halus (25 Jun 2023) and Pasir Ris Park (25 Apr 2023 to 13 May 2023), while five were spotted of Pasir Panjang Port on 29 Apr 2023. Breeding was recorded on the Rocks.

Other record: several nestings on the pier at Changi Naval Base on 5 May 2023.

Singapore Strait (including Singapore, Malaysian & Indonesian waters) – ten on 29 Apr 2023 and one each on 6 and 25 May 2023.

Common Tern

Sterna hirundo

An individual was spotted off Chek Jawa on 4 Feb 2023.

Great Crested Tern

Thalasseus bergii

Most records of sightings (20 out of 24) came from Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin, with high counts on 8 Jan 2023 (20) and 21 Jan 2023 (25). Four records came from Coney Island (2 Jan 2023; 6 birds), Keppel Harbour (9 Jan 2023; 1 bird), Kusu Island (11 Jan 2023; 1 bird) and Marina East (24 Jan 2023; 1 bird).

Lesser Crested Tern

Thalasseus bengalensis

Four birds were spotted off Chek Jawa on 21 Jan 2023, while one was seen on 23 Jan 2023 at the same location.

Lesser Adjutant

Leptoptilos javanicus

Sightings were concentrated around Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve and the surrounding areas of Lim Chu Kang and Neo Tiew Crescent. Between one and ten birds were regularly seen at Sungei Buloh, with high counts of ten birds on 21 Jan 2023 and eight on 12 Mar 2023. A high count of 18 birds was spotted from Neo Tiew Harvest Lane on 8 Jan 2023, likely being birds in flight as there were no other accompanying notes for this record.

Christmas Frigatebird

Fregata andrewsi

Other record: A juvenile photographed in flight at SBWR platform 1 on 7 May 2023.

Oriental Darter

Anhinga melanogaster

Mostly single birds were reported from Pulau Ubin (Pekan and Ubin Quarry), Singapore Quarry and the former quarry at Hindhede Nature Park. Single birds were also spotted flying over Pasir Ris (7 Jan 2023) and Jurong Lake Garden (9 Apr 2023).

Two birds were seen on the following days:

- 11 Jan 2023 two were seen at Hindhede, with one in the quarry and another in a dead tree across the quarry;
- 5 Feb 2023 two were seen flying from Jalan Wat Siam;
- 17 Mar 2023 two were seen at the same time at Pekan Quarry, one at one side while another was in a snag in the middle of the waters;
- 20 Apr 2023 six were seen at Pekan Quarry;
- 25 Apr 2023 two seen on wooden structure at Pekan Quarry;
- 12 May 2023 two seen perched on man-made scaffolding in the middle of the waters;
- 21 May 2023 one was seen at Pekan Quarry while another was spotted at Ubin Quarry.

During this period, there were four records of single birds seen at Hindhede and Singapore Quarry. However, as the timestamps of these sightings were not simultaneous, we cannot conclude if these records were of two different birds or the same bird visiting two locations on the same day.

Von Schrenck's Bittern

Ixobrychus eurhythmus

The last record for the season came from a bird seen in a small pond off Dairy Farm Nature Park on 7 Apr 2023; a bird was also spotted at the same location on 20 Mar 2023. Other sighting locations included a single male at Thomson Nature Park on 8 Feb 2023, a single bird at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve on 28 Jan 2023, and an individual at Windsor Nature Park on 13 & 15 Jan 2023, and 5 May 2023.

Cinnamon Bittern

Ixobrychus cinnamomeus

The species is resident, with numbers augmented by migrants. Mostly single birds were seen between Jan and May 2023, with the last sighting record on 7 May 2023 at Jurong Lake Gardens. Normally reclusive, sightings of up to two birds were reported at Marina East Drive between 1 Jan 2023 and 30 Apr 2023, at Singapore Botanic Gardens between 29 Jan 2023 and 24 Mar 2023 and Windsor Nature Park between 21 Feb 2023 and 20 Apr 2023. Individuals also have been spotted at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park between 14 Feb 2023 and 4 Apr 2023, the former Transview Golf Course at Dover between 4 Mar 2023 and 6 Apr 2023, Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 between 10-24 Jan 2023, Neo Tiew Harvest Lane and Turut Drive between 1 Jan 2023 and 1 Apr 2023, NTU on 2 Mar 2023, and Rail Corridor near Kranji-Woodlands Road on 25 Mar 2023. There were two sightings at Jurong Lake Gardens, with the aforementioned date as well as another sighting on 15 Apr 2023.

Black Bittern

The last record for the season came from a bird seen on Heron Island at Jurong Lake Gardens on 7 May 2023. This may be an overstayer as the last tranche of records came from a bird seen at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park between 27 Mar 2023 and 9 Apr 2023. The other sightings of this bird came from Marina East on 27 Jan 2023 and 1 Mar 2023. Both records were of single individuals.




Map showing sighting locations of the Grey Heron between Jan and Jun 2023.

A total of 845 sighting records were reported during this period. Fifty-five birds were counted at Pulau Ubin on 22 Jan 2023, while there was another record of 47 birds seen on Ubin on 19 Jan 2022.

One juvenile was seen at Sungei Buloh on 3 Feb 2023.




Map showing sighting locations of the Purple Heron between Jan and Jun 2023.


A total of 489 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. High counts of between eleven (1 Jun 2023) and 21 birds (27 May 2023) were recorded from the colony at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio Park.

Other records: one caught a Slaty-breasted Rail at Seletar crescent in March 2023, another caught and ate a Slaty-breasted Rail at Berlayer Creek on 6 Apr 2023.

Breeding reported. Nesting colony at Bishan-Ang Mo Kio is active, based on reports of mostly juveniles seen in the tree on 14 and 24 Jun 2023. Juveniles were also seen at Marina East (two birds on 1 Jan 2023), Sungei Buloh (one each on 21 Jan 2023 and 4 Feb 2023) and Jalan Pelikat Park Connector at Hougang (one bird on 5 Jun 2023).



Individuals continue to be seen up till 29 Jun 2023 at various locations such as Seletar End/Piccadillly, Pasir Ris Farmway and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve. High counts were recorded from Sungei Buloh on 13 Jan 2023 (16), 11 Mar 2023 (14) and 17 Jun 2023 (12).




Sizeable numbers continue to be seen in Jun 2023 at various locations such as Marina East Drive, Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, Pasir Ris Farmway 1 and Satay-by-the-Bay etc., with eleven counted at Sungei Buloh on 26 Jun 2023. High counts were noted from Sungei Buloh on 21 Jan 2023 (17) and 25 Feb 2023 (15), while an observer noted fourteen on 12 Feb 2023 in the fields along Marina East Drive.

Chinese Egret

The last record was of a single bird at Chek Jawa on 14 May 2023. The last time two birds were seen was on 29 Apr 2023, of which one was an individual that had a tag.



Sizeable numbers continue to be seen in Jun 2023, with high counts of 25 on 26 Jun 2023 and 20 on 22 Jun 2023. High counts of 60 birds were recorded on 6 Jan 2023 and 4 Feb 2023 from Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve, and 60 from Pasir Ris Farmway 1 on 6 Jan 2023.




Pacific Reef-Heron






Map showing sighting locations of the Chinese Pond Heron between Jan and Jun 2023.

An individual at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve spotted on 8 Jun 2023, and another at Lorong Halus Wetland on 30 May 2023 were the last birds seen for the season. 





Up to three juveniles were reported from 13 Jan 2023 to 30 Jun 2023. Pairs were seen at Pasir Ris Farmway and Tuas South but there were no indications of breeding activity. Single birds were seen at Kranji Marsh, Lim Chu Kang Lane 3, Neo Tiew Harvest Lane, Lorong Halus Wetland, and Ulu Pandan Park Connector near Faber Heights.

Oriental Honey Buzzard - observation dates & numbers




High counts were observed on 18 Feb 2023 from Henderson Waves (12; comprising a large flock of seven, with individuals flying over thereafter) and on 10 Apr 2023 (30 flying north-east). Following the sighting of thirty birds, individuals continue to be seen right up till 25 Jun 2023. Based on the chart above, it is possible that most migratory Honey Buzzards would have left by end-April and early-May. While the individuals seen in the later part of May through June could be stragglers, or summering birds or perhaps of the resident subspecies.



Map showing sighting locations of the Jerdon's Baza between Jan and Jun 2023.




The last record for the season came from a sighting of a single bird from Mount Faber on 2 Apr 2023. 

Fifteen birds were seen on 2 Jan 2023 on Coney Island, while twelve were seen to be roosting near the beach the day before on the same island.

Given that there are resident and migratory Crested Serpent Eagles in this region, it is likely that sightings at the following locations are possibly residents due to past records and the time period of the encounter:

- Jalan Gemala 2 single bird seen on 13 May 2023;
- Pulau Ubin single birds seen between 2 Apr 2023 and 28 Jun 2023.

The following sightings are possibly migratory birds as they were seen during the migratory season, although we cannot be certain if the sighting at P. Tekong is that of a resident bird given that the island is under-surveyed and has suitable habitat, and if the sightings at Botanic Gardens were that of the Goldhill birds.

- Telok Blangah Hill Park single bird on 12 Jan 2023.

A juvenile was reported from Pulau Ubin on 25 Apr 2023 and 12 May 2023.





Chinese Sparrowhawk

The last record for the season was of two birds spotted over Telok Blangah Hill Park on 4 Apr 2023 as part of a mixed flock of 14 raptors, together with some Japanese Sparrowhawk *Accipiter gularis* and Black Baza *Aviceda leuphotes*. A high count of five birds was reported from Mount Faber Park on 2 Apr 2023 as they headed north. Other notable sightings include the following:

- The female at Ang Mo Kio Town Garden West first spotted on 22 Nov 2022; it was spotted on 23 Jan 2023 and 24 Feb 2023;
- Up to two individuals were seen on Coney Island between 1 and 12 Jan 2023.

The last record for the season was for four birds spotted at Singapore Botanic Gardens on 26 Apr 2023. Peak return migration appeared to occur between end March and mid-April, as eBirders recorded high counts of eight birds on 31 Mar 2023 (Telok Blangah Hill Park), 20 on 2 and 10 Apr 2023, and a high of 30 (possibly more) on 26 Mar 2023 from Mount Faber Park.



Birds were commonly encountered at the Central Catchment Nature Reserve and adjacent buffer parks, as well as suburban locations such as Nanyang Technological University, Pulau Ubin and Pasir Ris Park. An individual was found resting on a grass patch on 29 Jan 2023 at Pearl's Hill City Park. Breeding recorded. An adult was seen feeding a chick on 6 Jun 2023 inside the Central Catchment.

Other record: a fledgling at SBWR on 15 Apr 2023.

Oriental Scops-Owl

A single bird was found injured inside Windsor Nature Park around the Squirrel Trail on 4 Feb 2023. Another bird, a brown morph, was seen inside Mandai Track 15 on 26 Feb 2023.



The last record for the season was a record from Windsor Nature Park on 25 Mar 2023. An observer living around King's Road reported hearing a one-note call of the kingfisher on 7 Mar 2023 around 8:30 pm, possibly of a bird on night-time migration.

An individual was spotted at Admiralty Park between 7 and 10 Apr 2023. Other record: one found dead at Penjuru on 30 Mar 2023.

Black-capped Kingfisher

Individuals were spotted at Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 (5 Jan 2023 to 4 Feb 2023), Pasir Ris Farmway 1 (6 Jan 2023 to 9 Feb 2023) and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve (11 Feb 2023), the lattermost being the last sighting for the season.


Birds were present from 1 Jan 2023 to 30 Jun 2023.

Birds were seen from 1 Jan 2023 to 30 Jun 2023. There is no discernible seasonality for the species, although the last peak of 5 birds and more was on 31 May 2023. Breeding recorded. Courtship feeding and mating observed at Mount Faber on 29 Mar 2023, and an adult was seen feeding a juvenile at Singapore Botanic Gardens on 19 Jun 2023. Other record: two chicks in a nest hole at Berlayer Creek in April 2023.

Map showing sighting locations of the Coppersmith Barbet between Jan and Jun 2023.






Red-crowned Barbet at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 25 Feb 2023 (Geoff Lim).

Sightings continue to centre around the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks, with one exceptional record from the Singapore Botanic Gardens on 14 May 2023. The gardens hosted a barbet in Feb 2022 (see Singapore Bird Report Jan- Jun 2022). High counts of four and above have been reported, with four birds reported from Lower Peirce Reservoir Park (8 Jan 2023), Central Catchment (18 Feb 2023 and 12 Mar 2023), Thomson Nature Park (25 May 2023) and six seen or heard at various locations within the Central Catchment on 10 Jun 2023. Breeding reported. A pair with a recently fledged juvenile was seen, as well as a young being fed by an adult in a nest hole were observed on 10 Jun 2023 within the Central Catchment. Individual birds inspecting or excavating nest holes were also reported; an individual was reported to be digging a hole in a dead tree trunk on 12 Feb 2023 near Jelutong Tower, while up to two birds were reported inspecting a tree hole on 11-12 Mar 2023. Two were reported to be nesting in a tree "near the trail into Wallace Education Center" on 24 Feb 2023.



Lineated Barbet


Map showing sighting locations of the Lineated Barbet between Jan and Jun 2023.



Map showing sighting locations of the Peregrine Falcon between Jan and Jun 2023.



A total of 229 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. High numbers were reported from the following locations: twenty birds from Sentosa on 14 Mar 2023, fifteen from Bukit Timah on 16 Jun 2023, ten from Telok Blangah Hill Park on 10 Jan 2023, and eight from SkyVille@Dawson (Queenstown) on 23 Feb 2023 and Changi Village on 6 Apr 2023. A pair was chased out from their nest cavity in Changi Village on 17 Jun 2023 by Oriental Pied Hornbill, while a pair was seen chasing an Oriental Honey Buzzard on the grounds of Shangri-La Rasa on Sentosa on 28 Mar 2023. A hybrid Tanimbar Corella x Yellow-crested Cockatoo (*Cacatua goffiniana x sulphurea*) was spotted between 19 Jan 2023 and 16 Apr 2023 at Jurong Lake Gardens, while two were seen at MacRitchie Reservoir Park on 21 May 2023, and one with an unusual crest was seen at Victoria Hall on 28 May 2023.



Sightings remained confined around the Central Catchment and adjoining buffer parks. Six birds were spotted on 1 Mar 2023, and five on 15 Mar 2023. Two males and a female were spotted feeding off a fruiting *Magnolia champaca* (Chempaka) tree on 28 Jan 2023. 









By now, it has become increasingly hard to determine when migratory birds have left the island, as sightings and vocalisations continue to be recorded from late Apr 2023 onwards by probable residents at locations such as Pulau Ubin (29 Apr 2023 to 28 Jun 2023) and Kranji Marsh & vicinity (10 May 2023 to 28 Jun 2023), as well as other locations such as Holland Plain (single birds on 28 Apr 2023 & 26 Jun 2023), Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 (single bird on 29 Apr 2023), Lorong Halus Wetland (single bird on 4 Jun 2023), Marina East Drive (single bird on 27, 28 & 29 May 2023) and Sungei Tengah on 28 Jun 2023. High counts recorded on Pulau Ubin (10 on 20 May 2023, eight on 16 May 2023, and seven on 20 Apr 2023), while four birds were recorded from Kranji Marsh on 28 May 2023.

Other record: one dead on a flower pot (possibly due to building collision) on 1 Apr 2023.

Hooded Pitta Pitta sordida

The last bird for the season was an individual seen at Oriole Crescent on 27 Apr 2023. Other sightings were at more conventional locations such as Central Catchment and buffer nature parks, Botanic Gardens and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve.

Mangrove Pitta


Map showing sighting locations of the Golden-bellied Gerygone between Jan and Jun 2023.

Records of a single bird from Pulau Ubin were received between 16 Apr 2023 and 11 Jun 2023. Most records were indicated as being from Chek Jawa. Incidentally one observer noted the presence of two birds at Chek Jawa on 15 May 2023.

Common lora

A total of 1,975 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Breeding reported. A nest was reported at Kranji Marsh. Adults were seen incubating inside the nest on 13 and 20 May 2023, while two young chicks were seen within the nest on 3 Jun 2023. Other record: an adult sitting on a nest at Pasir Ris Street 71 in April 2023.

Malaysian Pied-Fantail

Rhipidura javanica

A total of 982 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: an adult feeding its fledgling at Choa Chu Kang Park on 28 Mar 2023, a nest with two chicks at SBG on 22 May 2023.

Ashy Drongo

Dicrurus leucophaeus

The last record for the season came from an individual spotted at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin on 12 May 2023. An individual was spotted at Singapore Botanic Gardens on 12 Jan 2023; another tranche of records for this venue was of an individual recorded between 6 and 12 Mar 2023. Another individual was reported from Mount Faber Park on 18 Mar 2023.

Crow-billed Drongo

Dicrurus annectens

The last record for this season was from the canal at Changi Business Park on 16 Apr 2023. Mostly single birds were reported from the Central Catchment Reserves and buffer nature parks, Changi Business Park, Pulau Ubin, Sentosa, Singapore Botanic Gardens, Tuas South and the BirdLife (Asia) office at Queenstown.

Greater Racket-tailed Drongo

Dicrurus paradiseus

A total of 825 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Other record: a nest at Windsor Nature Park on 2 May 2023.

Japanese Paradise-Flycatcher

Terpsiphone atrocaudata

There were only five sightings between Jan and Jun 2023 – Singapore Botanic Gardens on 16 Jan 2023 and 8 Apr 2023, Jurong Lake Gardens on 1, 8 and 16 Apr 2023, and Berlayer Creek Boardwalk on 8 Apr 2023. There was mass movement on 8 Apr 2023 as there were records of individual birds at Berlayer, Jurong Lake Gardens (a male and female seen at 12.00 pm and 1.30 pm respectively) and Singapore Botanic Gardens that day. Another noteworthy record was that a number were males with developed long tails, viz. on 1 Apr 2023 at Jurong Lake Gardens, 8 Apr 2023 at Singapore Botanic Gardens, Jurong Lake Gardens and Berlayer and 16 Apr 2023 at Jurong Lake Gardens. The last record for the season was the long-tailed male spotted at Jurong Lake Gardens on the afternoon of 16 Apr 2023.

Amur Paradise-Flycatcher

Terpsiphone incei

The last record for this season was a sighting of an individual at Berlayer Creek Boardwalk on 13 Apr 2023, while an individual spotted within the grounds of the Singapore Botanic Gardens on 15 Mar 2023 was the first eBird record for the season. Individuals were subsequently spotted at Labrador Nature Reserve on 4 Apr 2023, Marina East on 8 Apr 2023, Jurong Lake Gardens on 10 Apr 2023, Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre on 11 Apr 2023, followed by the penultimate record for the season.

Blyth's Paradise-Flycatcher

Terpsiphone affinis

There were three records for this season – 13 Jan 2023, 2 & 3 Mar 2023 – from Singapore Botanic Gardens, possibly because it was difficult for observers to determine whether sightings, especially of white morphed birds were Blyth's or Amur Paradise-Flycatchers (e.g., individual seen on 4 Apr 2023 at Berlayer Creek Boardwalk).

Tiger Shrike

The last record for the season was an adult male seen foraging at Dillenia Hut on 1 May 2023.

Brown Shrike

The last record for the season was an individual spotted at Marina East on 16 May 2023.

A total of 233 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Breeding recorded. A juvenile was spotted on 13 Mar 2023 at Marina East.

The last record for the season was an individual spotted at Marina East on 13 May 2023.

Oriental Reed Warbler

The last record for the season was an individual spotted at Marina East on 27 May 2023.

Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler

The last record for the season was an individual spotted at Marina East on 24 May 2023.

Lanceolated Warbler



A total of 1,412 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: two fledglings begging to be fed at the Botanic Gardens in April 2023.

Red-rumped Swallow

The last record for this season was an individual seen at Lim Chu Kang Lane 3 on 5 Feb 2023.

Black-headed Bulbul

Brachypodius melanocephalos

A single individual was seen at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 29 Jan 2023, as well as between 4 and 7 Mar 2023, and on 10 and 12 Mar 2023, feeding in the false curry leaf trees and other trees around the Wallace Education Centre and along Wallace Trail.

Black-crested Bulbul

Rubigula flaviventris

A single bird was seen at Bukit Timah Nature Reserve on 18 Feb 2023, and two individuals reported at Windsor Nature Park on 17 Jan 2023.

Red-whiskered Bulbul

Pycnonotus jocosus

A total of 369 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Light-vented Bulbul

Pycnonotus sinensis

A single bird seen at Changi Bay Point on 19 Apr 2023 was likely an escapee. This species is not in the NSS checklist.

Sooty-headed Bulbul

Pycnonotus aurigaster

A total of 95 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. The birds were mainly concentrated in the east. Outlier locations include Ang Mo Kio Linear Park (near Luxus Hills) (between two and three birds on 5 & 6 Jan 2023), Turut Track (single bird on 25 Feb 2023), Dairy Farm (one on 25 Mar 2023), Singapore Quarry (two on 28 Mar 2023) and Berlayer Creek Boardwalk (one on 10 Jun 2023). It remains to be seen whether those indicated at Turut, Dairy Farm, Singapore Quarry and Berlayer were correctly identified birds that have spread beyond the species' eastern stronghold.

Striped-throated Bulbul

A total of 2,962 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: a nest at Hampstead Wetlands in March 2023.

Olive-winged Bulbul

A total of 858 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: a nest with one chick at Berlayer Creek on 12 Apr 2023.

Cream-vented Bulbul

Pycnonotus simplex

A total of 63 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Sighting records have been concentrated within the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks.

Red-eyed Bulbul

Pycnonotus brunneus

A total of 192 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Breeding recorded; an adult was seen feeding a juvenile several times at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 26 Jun 2023. A single record of one bird was reported from Singapore Botanic Gardens on 18 Jan 2023.

Cinereous Bulbul

Hemixos cinereus

Between 19 Apr 2023 and 7 May 2023, mostly individuals and pairs were spotted at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin. High counts of between six and eight individuals were recorded on 22 Apr 2023

Yellow-browed Warbler

Phylloscopus inornatus

The last record for the season was of a single bird heard calling from the canopy of a Yellow Flame tree at Ang Mo Kio Garden West on 25 Feb 2023. Apart from nature parks, birds were seen or heard at Satay-by-the-Bay, Changi Beach Park, Pasir Ris Park and Sungei Buloh

Dusky Warbler

Phylloscopus fuscatus

An individual was recorded at Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve on 5 and 14 May 2023.

Eastern Crowned Warbler

Phylloscopus coronatus

The season's last record was of two birds reported from Pulau Ubin on 21 Apr 2023.

Sakhalin Leaf Warbler


Phylloscopus borealoides

An individual was heard calling intermittently from Petai Trail at MacRitchie Reservoir Park on 10 Feb 2023.

Arctic Warbler

Phylloscopus borealis

Arctic Warbler - observation dates & numbers



An individual spotted on 17 May 2023 along Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve constituted the season's last record. A total of 453 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. High counts were recorded in mid-Jan 2023 and mid-Apr 2023, suggesting two movement peaks during the first half of the year.

Swinhoe's White-eye

Zosterops simplex

A total of 544 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Pin-striped Tit-Babbler

Mixornis gularis

A total of 725 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: nestbuilding at Henderson Road on 9 May 2023.

Chestnut-winged Babbler

Cyanoderma erythropterum

There were only five records of this babbler:

- Central Catchment Reserves: four records (13 Jun 2023 with three birds, one possible juvenile; 19 May 0223 with one bird, 13 Apr 2023 with two birds and 18 Mar 2023 with two birds near Jelutong Tower);
- A record of one bird from Thomson Nature Park on 19 Feb 2023.



Short-tailed Babbler

A total of 31 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Most sightings remain clustered within the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks, with one audio record from Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin, which needs further investigation and confirmation.


White-chested Babbler

Abbott's Babbler

Chinese Hwamei

Garrulax canorus

A single bird was reported from Sentosa on 27 and 31 Jan 2023.

White-crested Laughingthrush

Garrulax leucolophus

A total of 246 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Black-throated Laughingthrush

Pterorhinus chinensis

One individual was reported from Clementi Forest/Green Corridor on 4 Feb 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Asian Glossy Starling

Aplonis panayensis

A total of 1990 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: a fledgling at Hort Park on 30 Apr 2023.

A total of 621 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. High counts of 15 birds were recorded from the Central Catchment on 26 Feb 2023 and Singapore Botanic Gardens on 30 Jan 2023.

Daurian Starling

Agropsar sturninus

A total of 39 sighting records were reported between Jam amd Jun 2023. The last record of the season came from a sighting of an unknown number of birds at Jurong Lake Gardens on 5 Apr 2023.

Siamese Pied Starling

Gracupica floweri

One bird was reported from Sungei Tengah on 4 Jan 2023 while another was seen at Jurong Lake Gardens on 25 Feb 2023. This species is not in the NSS checklist.

Gracula religiosa

White-shouldered Starling

Sturnia sinensis

Eight birds were seen at Rower's Bay Park on 20 Jan 2023 while five were spotted at Seletar Aerospace Crescent on 11 Jan 2023.

Red-billed Starling

Spodiopsar sericeus

The single female first spotted at Loewen Road, Dempsey Hill on 26 Dec 2022 continued to be seen until 6 Jan 2023. Another record, the sixth record for Singapore, was recorded from Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve on 7 Jan 2023. A pair was photographed on tree tops within the Reserve's grounds.

Common Myna

Acridotheres tristis

A total of 821 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Vinous-breasted Myna

Acridotheres leucocephalus

A single individual was seen flying from Amoy Quee Camp into a tree along Ang Mo Kio Avenue 5 on 24 Mar 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Javan Myna

Acridotheres javanicus

A total of 3,477 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Siberian Thrush

Geokichla sibirica

A single bird was seen at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 3, 4 and 5 Jan 2023.

Orange-headed Thrush

Geokichla citrina

A single bird was seen at Singapore Botanic Gardens between 27 Feb 2023 and 3 Mar 2023.

Eyebrowed Thrush

Turdus obscurus

Single birds were spotted at Dairy Farm Nature Park on 5 Jan 2023, 21 Jan 2023 and 5 Mar 2023, while an individual was seen within Bukit Timah Nature Reserve on 21 May 2023.

Dark-sided Flycatcher

Muscicapa sibirica

The last record for this season was an individual spotted on 29 Apr 2023 at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin.

Asian Brown Flycatcher

Muscicapa dauurica

A single bird spotted at Lower Seletar Reservoir Park on 30 Apr 2023 constituted the last record for this season. A total of 545 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Brown-streaked Flycatcher

Muscicapa williamsoni

The last record for the season came from a bird spotted at East Coast Park on 14 Mar 2023. Individuals were seen at Bukit Timah Nature Reserve on 11 Feb 2023, NTU on 19 Jan 2023, Jurong Lake Gardens on 8 Jan 2023, Dempsey Hill on 7 Jan 2023 and at Fort Canning Park on 1 Jan 2023.

Oriental Magpie-Robin

Copsychus saularis

A total of 1,482 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

White-rumped Shama

Copsychus malabaricus

A total of 229 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Most records were from the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks, and Pulau Ubin. Records from Block 411 Commonwealth Avenue West between 20 and 26 Mar 2023, Changi Bay Point on 18 Jun 2023 and Tampines Eco-Green on 29 Jun 2023 are likely to be escapees.


Blue-and-White Flycatcher

Cyanoptila cyanomelana

A single male was spotted between 5 and 25 Mar 2023 at Dairy Farm Nature Park, between the false curry leaf trees near the Wallace Education Centre and mulberry trees further away.

A female individual was also spotted within the park grounds on 12-15 Jan 2023, and 5-8 Mar 2023. However, it was not possible to determine if the female bird(s) were *C. cyanomelana* or *C. cumatilis*.

Other record: a male photographed at Pasir Ris PArk on 20 Mar 2023.

The last record for this season were two individuals spotted at two separate locations within the Central Catchment on 5 Apr 2023. Sighting records were confined within the Central Catchment and buffer parks. Peak movement appeared to be between end-Jan and early Feb 2023, as more birds were encountered: four on 29 Jan 2023 along Rifle Range Link and three on 10 Feb 2023 bathing in a stream along Petai Trail at MacRitchie Reservoir Park.

Yellow-rumped Flycatcher

Ficedula zanthopygia

The last record for the season came from a sighting in Rifle Range Link of one individual on 28 Apr 2023. A high count of four birds on 2 Apr 2023 at Tuas South, and three birds on 5 Apr 2023 from the Central Catchment and another three on 15 Apr 2023 from Singapore Quarry suggested that peak movement occurred from early to mid-Apr 2023.

Green-backed Flycatcher

Ficedula elisae

The last record for the season came from a sighting near Dillenia Hut within the Central Catchment on 13 Apr 2023. Records this season (49 records) came from the Central Catchment and buffer parks. The male at Dairy Farm was the most accessible bird for the season and was reported from 18 Feb 2023 until 26 Mar 2023. There was more than one bird, as two were recorded on 9 Mar 2023, the usual one just before the Wallace Education Centre, as well as another seen at Carpark B.

Mugimaki Flycatcher

Ficedula mugimaki

An individual spotted within Labrador Nature Reserve on 11 Apr 2023 was the last for the season. Between one and two birds were seen at Jurong Lake Gardens between 23 Jan 2023 and 9 Apr 2023, while single birds were reported from Dairy Farm Nature Park (1 Jan 2023), Own Road Block 46 (26 Mar 2023), Pasir Ris Park (26 Mar 2023) and Tuas South (2 Apr 2023).

Blue Rock-Thrush

Monticola solitarius

A Blue Rock Thrush was seen at Bedok on 4 Jan 2023 (Andy Lee).

Sightings of single birds were reported from the Sky Oasis@Dawson on 1 Jan 2023, as well as Commonwealth Towers on 3 & 4 Jan 2023.

Other records: an individual was spotted at Bedok on 4 Jan 2023.

Orange-bellied Flowerpecker

Dicaeum trigonostigma A total of 249 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Scarlet-backed Flowerpecker

Dicaeum cruentatum A total of 742 sighting records were reported between Jul and Dec 2022.

Ruby-cheeked Sunbird

Chalcoparia singalensis

Other record: A single bird was recorded from Kranji Marsh on 17 May 2023 by AK Wee.

Brown-throated Sunbird

Anthreptes malacensis

A total of 1,125 sighting records were reported between Jul and Dec 2022.

Van Hasselt's Sunbird

Leptocoma brasiliana

Birds were recorded from Pulau Ubin (3 records), the Central Catchment and buffer parks (14 records) between 18 Jan 2023 and 23 May 2023.

Copper-throated Sunbird

Leptocoma calcostetha

Birds were reported from the usual locations of Pulau Ubin (27 records) and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve (115 records). A high count of 13 birds on 16 May 2023 from Sungei Buloh (2-3 males and 6-7 females).

Olive-backed Sunbird

Cinnyris jugularis

A total of 2,093 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other record: nesting recorded at Turut Track on 22 Mar 2023, and a nest used thrice – Feb-Mar (chicks fledged), Apr-May (chicks fledged) and again in June 2023.

Crimson Sunbird

Aethopyga siparaja


A total of 549 sighting records were reported between Jan and Dec 2023

Little Spiderhunter

Arachnothera longirostra

Birds continue to be reported from the Central Catchment and buffer nature parks. A total of 132 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Asian Fairy-Bluebird

Up to two birds (males) were seen feeding in fruiting trees at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin between 22 and 29 Apr 2023.




Map showing sighting locations of Blue-winged Leafbird between Jan and Jun 2023.

A single bird was seen at Kranji Marsh on 26 Feb 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.




Map showing sighting locations of the Golden-backed Weaver between Jan and Jun 2023.

Baya Weaver

Asian Golden Weaver

Ploceus hypoxanthus

There were four sighting records for this season, with two from Tampines Eco Green (17 & 29 Jun 2023) and two from Lorong Halus Wetland (27 Jan 2023 & 25 Mar 2023). This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Zanzibar Red Bishop

Euplectes nigroventris

An individual was reported from Changi Bay Point on 19 May 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Bronze Mannikin

Spermestes cucullata

A single bird was reported from around Gardens by the Bay on 25 Apr 2023 and 7 Jun 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Scaly-breasted Munia

Lonchura punctulata

A total of 326 sighting records were reported between Jul and Dec 2022.

White-rumped Munia

Lonchura striata

Between one and four birds were recorded at Telok Blangah Hill Park on 12 and 15 Jan 2023.

Javan Munia

Lonchura leucogastroides

A total of 121 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Chestnut Munia

Lonchura atricapilla

A total of 201 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. Other records: nestbuilding observed at Kranji Marsh on 19 Feb 2023.

White-capped Munia

Lonchura ferruginosa

A single bird was reported between Ulu Pandan Linear Park and Clementi Linear Park between 19 Apr 2023 and 1 May 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist. Other record: one photographed at Seletar Aerospace Crescent on 10 Mar 2023.

White-headed Munia

Lonchura maja

A total of 125 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Orange-cheeked Waxbill

Estrilda melpoda

A total of 43 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Common Waxbill

Estrilda astrild

A total of 132 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Other records: nestbuilding observed at Kranji Marsh on 19 Feb 2023.

Black-rumped Waxbill

Estrilda troglodytes

Up to six birds were seen at Pasir Ris Farmway 1 between 6 Jan 2023 and 24 Jun 2023. One was seen at Marina East on 2 Jan 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Crimson-rumped Waxbill

Estrilda rhodopyga

One bird was seen in the vicinity of the Pasir Ris Farmway area on 13 Jan 2023, while another two were spotted on Pulau Ubin on 12 May 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Red Avadavat

Amandava amandava

A single bird was seen at Gardens by the Bay on 29 Apr 2023.

Pin-tailed Whydah

Vidua macroura



Pin-tailed Whydah at Pasir Ris Farmway 3 on 26 May 2023 (Maricel Cabanero).

Birds were reported at Changi Bay Point between 24 Mar 2023 and 17 Jun 2023, Pasir Ris Farmway between 26 May 2023 and 17 Jun 2023, and two sightings at Pasir Ris Park on 27 May 2023 and 2 Jun 2023. One male was noted to be sporting a long tail on 19 Apr 2023 and courtship behaviour at Pasir Ris Farmways from 27 May 2023 onwards. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

House Sparrow

Passer domesticus

A single individual was spotted at Marina East on 11 Feb 2023, while another was seen at Lorong Halus Wetland on 4 Jun 2023.

Eurasian Tree Sparrow

Passer montanus

A total of 926 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Forest Wagtail

Dendronanthus indicus

The last eBird record for the season was a sighting of a single bird within the Central Catchment on 18 Mar 2023.

Grey Wagtail

Motacilla cinerea

A bird seen at Holland Green Linear Park on 29 Mar 2023 was the last eBird record for the season. Birds continued to be observed at the communal wagtail roost at Block 153, Yishun Street 11, with eight birds seen on 18 Jan 2023, and two spotted on 1 Feb 2023.

Eastern Yellow Wagtail

Motacilla tschutschensis

The last eBird record for the season came from nine birds spotted at Marina East on 28 Apr 2023.

Other record: one *taivana* photographed at MED on 17 May 2023.

White Wagtail

Motacilla alba

The last eBird record for the season came from a sighting from Pandan Reservoir on 1 Apr 2023. Four birds were seen at the communal wagtail roost at Block 153, Yishun Street 11 on 1 Feb 2023.

Paddyfield Pipit

Anthus rufulus

A total of 455 sighting records were reported between Jan and Jun 2023.

Yellow-fronted Canary

Crithagra mozambica

Up to five birds were seen at Gardens by the Bay (including Bay East) between 1 Jan 2023 and 17 Jun 2023. This introduced species is not in the NSS checklist.

Black-throated Canary

Crithagra atrogularis
